- a. 'The rate of heart attacks continues to fall, and survival from them continues to improve.' Explain two reasons why this may be the case.

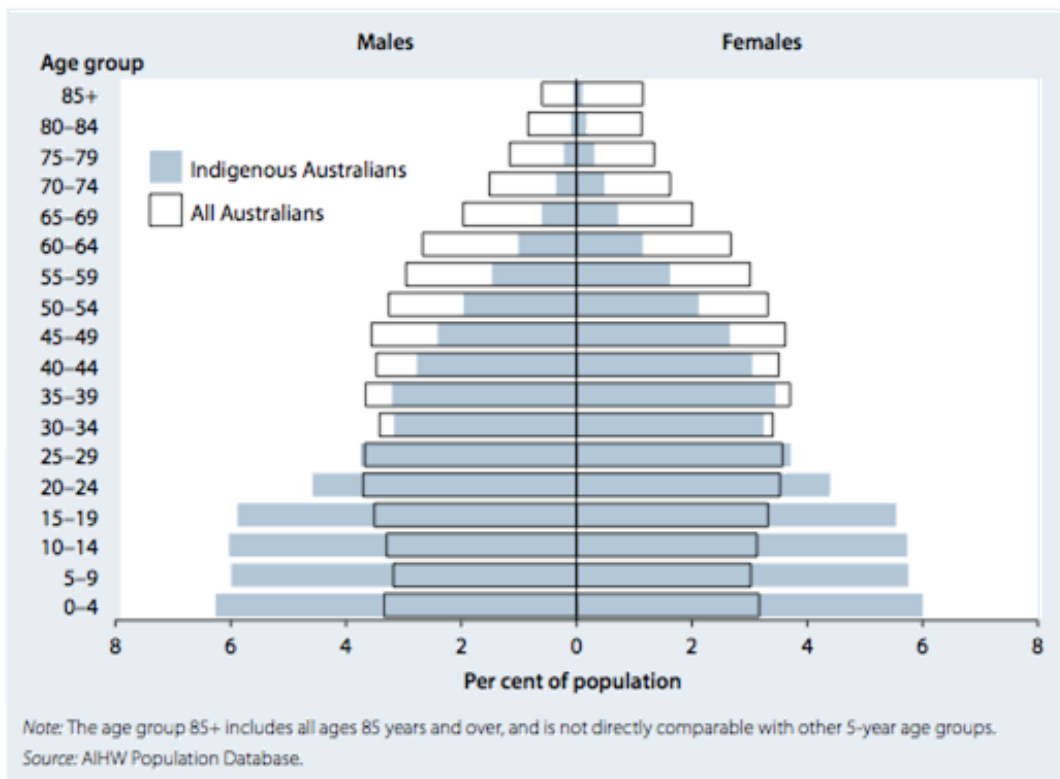
